

Definitions of Position Sensitivities

Special Sensitive	This position is reserved for personnel who require access to <u>Sensitive Compartmented Information</u> and other intelligence-related “Specially Sensitive” information.
Critical Sensitive	This position includes positions where the potential for exceptionally grave damage to the national security exists. This would include positions involving access up to and including <u>Top Secret</u> information.
Non-Critical Sensitive	This position includes positions where potential for some damage ranging up to serious damage to the national security exists. This would include positions that involve either access to <u>Secret or Confidential</u> national security information.
High Risk	This position includes positions that have the potential for exceptionally serious impact involving duties especially critical to the agency or a program mission with broad scope of policy or program authority such as policy development and implementation. <u>No clearance required.</u>
Moderate Risk	This position includes positions that have the potential for moderate to serious impact involving duties of considerable importance to the agency or program mission with significant program responsibilities and delivery of customer services to the public such as assistants to policy development and implementation. <u>No clearance required.</u>
Low Risk	All other positions which do not fall into any of the above categories. <u>No clearance required.</u>
